A high volume of recyclable materials were disposed of in Landfill bins <u>Leave No Trace</u> was duty-bound to accommodate (on our behalf) the oversight in Trash/Recycling, despite a shortfall in volunteer numbers for this category Service lines for indoor & outdoor bars were prohibitively long during the height of the event

A recommendation & self-nomination for Recycling Lead has been incorporated Suggestion of inclusion of Recycling Lead into all future regional events Sanitation/Port-o-potty requirements will be overestimated for future events Sound/noise limits will be more closely explored prior to the event to avoid violations Radio communication protocol will be implemented
